Healthy Relationships Training for School-aged Children K through High School

Working under the *Sexual Assault and Prevention Crisis Services* grant issued by the Office of the Attorney General, Wise Hope Crisis Center offers weekly programs-in either short term or long term format-as well as one-time presentations aimed at “extra-curricular” clubs, grade level female or male audiences, or school wide presentations.

Using videos, hand-outs, and fun, interest-building activities for grades K-12, the goal of the SAPCS grant is to educate and equip today’s students with the tools and ideologies necessary to recognize, eliminate, and reduce the factors that perpetuate violence to keep it from occurring in the first place.

Achieving this, it is believed, will create healthy norms and thereby healthy schools and communities.

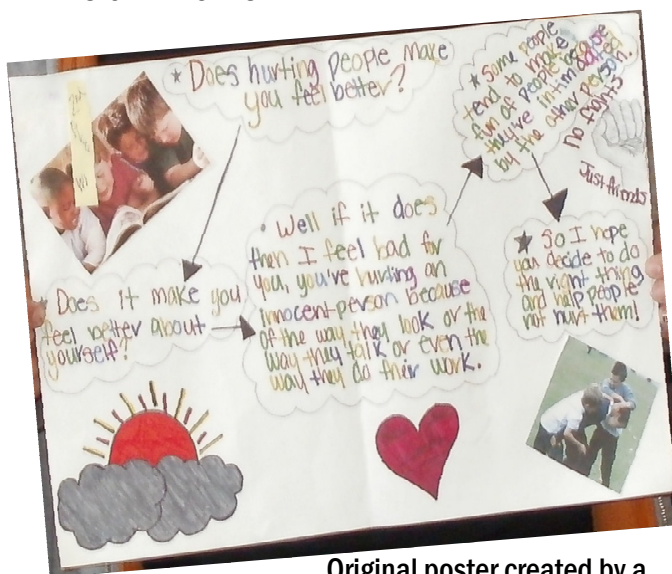
I PLEDGE Campaign:
